

Army CECOM CR2 (Subcontractor)

CR2, the U.S. Army Communications-Electronics Command (CECOM) Rapid Response Program, is CECOM's primary Homeland Defense Security contract. An eight-year contract available to Department of Defense (DOD) and other Federal Agencies, CR2 provides quick access to products and services to research, develop, upgrade, install, fabricate, test, operate, maintain, and support new and existing platforms, systems, and subsystems. Non-Federal agencies may use the CR2 contract if the work is within scope and federally funded.

Government program managers dealing with deteriorating inventories and shrinking budgets require competent industry resources without the traditional acquisition lead time. CR2 enables system, platform, and item managers to access a broad range of technical service and equipment providers and integrators as the complex Government equipment they manage requires attention during all phases of the equipment lifecycle.
